FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FIRST SELECTMAN

As many of you know, for the first few months of the new year, you seem to be rushing around getting all your information for your tax returns and figuring out what your household budget will now be. It's the same for us in the Town Hall. Each department has been reviewing what they have currently expensed in their budget compared to what they will need for the next fiscal year's budget — what has increased, new programs, State mandates, supplies, etc. We gather all this information, summarize the expenses in an overall report for the Board of Finance.

That is usually the easy part. The hard part is determining the income side of the budget. Some of you may be following the State of Connecticut's responses to what is or what is not going to be funded to the towns. Some changes the State has mentioned could be a new formula to calculate the amount of Educational Cost Sharing Funds (ECS) for towns, the amount of revenue that is distributed from the casinos, State property assessments within the town, and the possibility of towns paying a portion of the teacher's pensions.

These are just a few items that will impact each town's budget. As we await the State budget that could, might, maybe, possibly happen within the next few months, here in Warren we are working very hard to keep our budget expenses and the mill rate to the very lowest possible amount without hurting programs, customer services, and our infrastructure.

Join us on Thursday, May 4th for the Town's Budget Hearing at the Town Hall at 7:30pm. All Warren Residents are welcome to review the budget, comment, ask your budget questions or state your concerns to the Board of Finance and Selectmen.



The proposed budget will be posted on the town's website for your review prior to the hearing.

Social Services Department

Income Tax Preparation Assistance: AARP Foundation Tax Aide offers free tax preparation help to anyone age 50 or older that cannot afford a tax preparation service. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program offers free tax help for low-to moderate-income (under \$50,000) people who cannot prepare their own tax returns. Volunteers, sponsored by various organizations, receive training to help prepare basic tax returns.

Renter’s Rebate Program: If you are a senior 65+ or a person with a disability, and pay rent or share rent for an apartment, a cooperative, congregate housing, subsidized housing, or for a rooming house, you may be eligible for this program. The application period is April 1 to October 1, 2017. The rebate amount you may receive is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments you made in the PRIOR year (2016). Income limits: single person \$35,200.00; married couple \$42,900. Those that apply must meet at least one of the following criteria: Individual or spouse must be 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2016. Renter must be 50 years of age or older and the surviving spouse of a renter who at the time of death had qualified and was entitled to this program (provided the couple was living together at the time of death). Renter must be 18 years of age or older who is permanently and totally disabled under Social Security Disability guidelines. All Renters must have resided in the State of Connecticut for at least one year at any given time. To schedule an appointment, contact Leah Pullaro, Warren Social Services 860-868-7881.

Caregiver Wellness Program:

Catherine Vlasto, LCSW, a clinical social worker from New Milford VNA and Hospice, will present a program on **Caregiver Wellness** at Kent Senior Center, 1 Swifts Lane on March 29, 2017 at 10:00a.m. All caregivers are welcome. Lunch will be served afterwards at a suggested donation of \$4.00/person. Reservations are required for lunch. If you would like to stay for lunch, please call 860-927-2055 by Monday, March 27th.

Wellness of the caregiver and the recipient are equally as important. The psychological health of the family caregiver is negatively affected by providing care. Higher levels of stress, anxiety, depression and other mental health effects are

common among family members who care for an older relative or friend. It's easy to focus on everyone and everything other than yourself. *But remember:* Caring has an "I" in it. You can only care for others if you take care of YOU.

From the Office of Land Use

Sequence of Events for Construction of Dwellings, Additions, Pools or Accessory Buildings in the Town of Warren

As winter draws to a close, many residents begin to plan for spring building and improvement projects. Please be aware that dwellings, additions, barns, garages, decks, pools, and sheds all require permits. *This includes "COVER-IT" type sheds and Storable Swimming Pools.* The Inland Wetlands Regulations, Zoning Regulations and Town Ordinances are available online at www.warrenct.org. Here is a summary of the various steps involved for obtaining the required approvals:

For a new house, have a soil scientist flag any wetlands on the lot and have an engineer/surveyor develop a site plan that shows the proposed house, driveway, septic system, well location, and any wetlands or watercourses located by the soil scientist. Contact Torrington Area Health District at (860) 489-0436 for a list of soil scientists.

For a new house, obtain approval from the Torrington Area Health District for the proposed septic system and well location. If there is a septic system on your lot, the Health District must approve all additions, decks, and accessory buildings. The Health District has a separate pool application permit that must be obtained for all new swimming pools. Contact Richard Rossi, Sanitarian, at Torrington Area Health District at (860) 489-0436.

Obtain an Inland Wetlands Permit from the Warren Inland Wetlands Commission for any work proposed within 100' of a wetlands or watercourse (the regulated inland wetlands areas.) The Commission regulates construction, filling, and removal of material within the regulated wetlands and watercourse area. Contact Stacey Sefcik, Zoning and Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer on Mondays and Wednesdays between 9:30AM and 12:30PM at 860-868-7881 x 117. The Inland Wetlands Commission currently meets the fourth Thursday of each month at 7:00PM at Warren Town Hall. Applications should be submitted one week prior to a meeting.

Obtain a driveway permit from the Planning and Zoning Commission and the First Selectman for all new driveways and modifications to existing driveways. The Town's driveway regulations are detailed in Section 9 of the Town of Warren Zoning Regulations. Applications are available in the Land Use Office and the First Selectman's Office.

Obtain a Zoning Permit from Stacey Sefcik, Zoning & Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer, for proposed houses, additions, decks, pools, and accessory buildings -- including "cover-it" sheds and storable pools. The required setbacks in all zones throughout the Town of Warren are 30 feet for the front yard and 25 feet for side yards and rear yards. Properties located on or near the shorelines of major water bodies within Town may be required to meet additional Shoreline Setback requirements (see Section 16 of the Zoning Regulations.) Pools, decks and accessory buildings all require Zoning and Building permits and must meet the minimum zoning setback requirements.

Obtain a Building Permit from Joe Manley, Building Official. (860) 868-7881 ext. 111. He is available on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 7:30AM to 8:30AM and Thursday afternoons from 4:30PM to 6:00PM.

Please be aware that while projects such as drainage improvements, patio installation, shoreline stabilization, pond maintenance, and removal of beaver dams may not require zoning or building permits they will likely still require Inland Wetlands approval. If you are in doubt as to whether a permit is needed for your proposed project, please contact Stacey Sefcik prior to commencing any work.

The Land Use & Building Office personnel are available to answer any questions you may have and to help you navigate the permitting process in order to get your project underway as quickly as possible.
