Renter's Rebate Program

If you are a senior 65+ or a person with a disability, and pay rent or share rent for an apartment, a cooperative, congregate housing, subsidized housing, or for a rooming house, you may be eligible for the **RENTER'S REBATE PROGRAM.**

The application period is April 1 to October 1, 2016. The rebate amount you may receive is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments you made in the PRIOR year (2015).

Who is eligible?

• Individual or spouse must be 65 years of age or older as of December 31, 2015.

• OR Renter must be 50 years of age or older and the surviving spouse of a renter who at the time of death had qualified and was entitled to tax relief, provided the couple was living together at the time of death.

• OR Renter must be 18 years of age or older who is permanently and totally disabled under Social Security Disability guidelines.

• Renters must have resided in the State of Connecticut for at least one year at any given time.

Income Guidelines (no asset restriction) Single person \$35,200.00 Married Couple \$42,900

What documents should you provide?

- 2015 IRS Tax Return (if you filed)
- Proof of Social Security Income
- Proof of any and all other income (pensions, interest, dividends, etc.)
- W-2 form(s) if you worked
- All 2015 rent and utility receipts (or call Eversource and ask for printout for 2015)
- Proof of disability for those under 65 years of age.

From the Office of Land Use

Sequence of Events for Construction of Dwellings, Additions, Pools or Accessory Buildings in the Town of Warren



As winter draws to a close, many residents begin to plan for spring building and improvement projects. Please be aware that dwellings, additions, barns, garages, decks, pools, and sheds all require permits. *This includes "COVER-IT" type sheds and Storable Swimming Pools.* The Inland Wetlands Regulations, Zoning Regulations and Town Ordinances are available online at www.warrenct.org. Here is a summary of the various steps involved for obtaining the required approvals:

For a new house, have a soil scientist flag any wetlands on the lot and have an engineer/surveyor develop a site plan that shows the proposed house, driveway, septic system, well location, and any wetlands or watercourses located by the soil scientist. Contact Torrington Area Health District at (860) 489-0436 for a list of soil scientists.

For a new house, obtain approval from the Torrington Area Health District for the proposed septic system and well location. If there is a septic system on your lot, the Health District must approve all additions, decks, and accessory buildings. The Health District has a separate pool application permit that must be obtained for all new swimming pools. Contact Richard Rossi, Sanitarian, at Torrington Area Health District at (860) 489-0436.

Obtain an Inland Wetlands Permit from the Warren Inland Wetlands Commission for any work proposed within 100' of a wetlands or watercourse (the regulated inland wetlands areas.) The Commission regulates construction, filling, and removal of material within the regulated wetlands and watercourse area. Contact Stacey Sefcik, Zoning and Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer on Mondays and Wednesdays between 9:30AM and 12:30PM at 860-868-7881 x 117. The Inland Wetlands Commission currently meets the fourth Thursday of each month at 7:00PM at Warren Town Hall. Applications should be submitted one week prior to a meeting.

Obtain a driveway permit from the Planning and Zoning Commission and the First Selectman for all new driveways and modifications to existing driveways. The Town's driveway regulations are detailed in Section 9 of the Town of Warren Zoning Regulations. Applications are available in the Land Use Office and the First Selectman's Office.

Obtain a Zoning Permit from Stacey Sefcik, Zoning & Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer, for proposed houses, additions, decks, pools, and accessory buildings -- including "cover-it" sheds and storable pools. The required setbacks in all zones throughout the Town of Warren are 30 feet for the front yard and 25 feet for side yards and rear yards. Properties located on or near the shorelines of major water bodies within Town may be required to meet additional Shoreline Setback requirements (see Section 16 of the Zoning Regulations.) Pools, decks and accessory buildings all require Zoning and Building permits and must meet the minimum zoning setback requirements.

Obtain a Building Permit from Joe Manley, Building Official. (860) 868-7881 ext. 111. He is available on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 7:30AM to 8:30AM and Thursday afternoons from 4:30PM to 6:00PM.

Please be aware that while projects such as drainage improvements, patio installation, shoreline stabilization, pond maintenance, and removal of beaver dams may not require zoning or building permits they will likely still require Inland Wetlands approval. If you are in doubt as to whether a permit is needed for your proposed project, please contact Stacey Sefcik prior to commencing any work.

The Land Use & Building Office personnel are available to answer any questions you may have and to help you navigate the permitting process in order to get your project underway as quickly as possible.

Warren Land Trust

The Warren Land Trust is an advocacy group dedicated to the preservation of the rural character of Warren. Our mission is to preserve farmland, open space, natural and endangered resources such as wetlands, forests and wildlife habitats, to encourage outright gifting of land for permanent protection and the use of conservation easements to preserve open space.

The Warren Land Trust closed out 2015 with our annual meeting and a new conservation easement. Held just before Thanksgiving at the Academy, the annual meeting included a review of recent activities and a preview of our plans for 2016. We also introduced three new directors: Elizabeth Chandler, Ashley Dietrich, and Waltraud Tammen. We are excited about the financial, educational, and communications expertise – not to mention enthusiasm and love for the great outdoors - that these new board member will bring to the WLT! We were also pleased to discuss volunteering with some interested individuals at the meeting. Finally, the WLT is very grateful for the donation of our latest conservation easement, which will protect land in the Lake Waramaug view shed.

Winter tends to be a quieter time for land trust stewardship and programming. Property inspections are on hiatus after a year-end flurry, and we now have an opportunity to work on organizational and governance matters which we'd put on hold during the busy summer and fall. In addition to reviewing our strategic plan and annual work plan, we hope to debut an improved and more interactive website in the next few months, and will explore new programming ideas in greater depth.

In the coming months, we also look forward to getting better acquainted with our newest fee property – the Strong Preserve. Purchased last fall with the generous participation of a consortium of neighbors, this 53-acre parcel on Above All Road represents one of the highest points in Warren. We plan to work with a local arborist who has generously donated his firm's services to provide public trail access to this scenic wooded parcel, which was long the property of the Strong family.

Looking further ahead, the WLT will again participate in the Parks & Rec-sponsored Town Clean Up in late April (around Earth Day); we will sponsor our customary hike in conjunction with CT Trails weekend; we also hope to collaborate with the Warren Historical Society on a "heritage walk" later in the year. A community picnic celebrating the beauty of Warren's natural surroundings is also in the works. We know that those of you who attended the picnic at Angevine Farm a couple of years ago will be eagerly awaiting details...stay tuned!

The Warren Land Trust is always looking for volunteers, and there are many ways to get involved. No special knowledge is required, and we are happy to find an option that matches your schedule and your talents.
