From the Office of the First Selectman

In the August 22nd issue of the Republican American, there was an article about Winsted and how it has bounced back from its financial woes 5 years ago with a score of 82. Guess what score Warren received? According to the Yankee Institute for Public Policy Warren tied for 3rd place with Cornwall for a score of 96!

The scoring method assigns a 0-100 rating for a municipality based on 5 factors:

1) the ratio of a town's general fund balance to its expenditures (40% weighting)

2) the ratio of its long-term obligations to total governmentwide revenues (30% weighting)

3) the ratio of actuarially determined pension contributions to total government-wide revenues (10% weighting)

4) the change in local unemployment rate (10% weighting)

5) the change in property values (10% weighting)

A score of 70 or above is considered healthy: 50-70 are marginal: below 50 face severe fiscal distress and are in danger of becoming insolvent. What is very sad to see is that 60 towns received a score lower than 70 and they are not just the large cities. Sprague (population 2984) received a score of 50 and Brookfield received a score of 59.

We are so very proud of our 3rd place rating along with our neighboring Town of Cornwall.

Congratulations to Bridgewater (99) and Eastford (98) for ranking 1st and 2nd in the State.



From the office of the Registrars



According to reports from the Registrars of Voters in other towns, Warren had one of the highest turn out rates in the recent CT primary election; well over 40% of all eligible electors came to the polls and voted on August 14th. Statewide, barely 30% of eligible voters showed up at the polls. Unaffiliated voters found that they were not able to vote as they needed to be registered as Democrats or Republicans to vote in any Connecticut primary. Many have

since applied to join one of the two major parties. Connecticut and other states have noticed a recent surge in new voter registrations, particularly among younger people. Warren's registrars hope that all Warren voters of any party come to the polls on November 6th to cast their vote in the mid-term elections.







Friends of Warren School will be streaming the Concert live so that Cohen and his family can watch wherever they are home or in the hospital.


WMG – Tots Soccer program
