

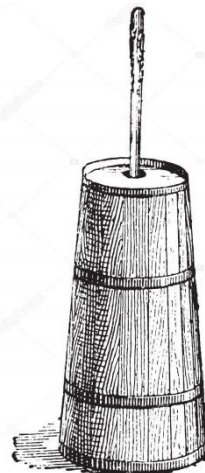


It is morning on March 24, 1813
