

# Town of Warren Spring Newsletter 2023

Welcome to Spring! Spring brings us warmer weather, birds chirping, bears going through our garbage and the



Town Budget. The staff has been working on their individual department budgets over the past few months and have submitted them to the First Selectman, who in

turn crunches the numbers to discuss with his board before presenting it to the Board of Finance. The budget also includes capital planning, contracts and the RSD #6 draft budget. The draft budget will be presented to the Board of Finance in April.

Join us on *Thursday, May 4th at 7:30 pm* for the Budget Hearing at the Town Hall. All Warren Residents are welcome to review the budget, comment, ask your questions or state your concerns to the Board of Finance and Selectmen.

A SSESSMENT

<u>What is a Revaluation:</u> A revaluation is the process of performing a mass appraisal of all real property within the assessment jurisdiction. The purpose of a revaluation is not to raise revenue but to have all property assessments reflect 70% of market value as of 1 point in time (10/1/2022). Revaluations are meant to capture changes in fair market value. This year Warren was one of 39 towns that experienced the mandatory 5-year revaluation. All towns saw a dramatic increase to their

grand list. Most increases were the effects of COVID, where homes were sold at an alarming rate and for prices well above the market value. Letters were sent by the Reval Company to contact them to discuss their assessment concerns and then if needed, to place an application with the Board of Assessment Appeals. The Board held hearings in March and has completed their duties per CGS 12-117a. The newly adjusted grand list will be used to determine the mill rate based on the approved town budget.

#### June is Dog License Month!

Pursuant to Sec. 22-338 of the CT General Statutes all dogs over six months of age must be registered. A current rabies certificate must be submitted or be on file with the Town Clerk. Neutered or spayed dogs are only \$8, male or female dogs are \$19. Remember a tag is a lost dog's ticket home, and it's the law! Registration reminders will be sent out.

There are different ways to register: online, by mail or in person. If you choose to register online, you will need to have licensed your dog last year, and the rabies certificate must be current. Access to online renewal will be available on June 1st.

Welcome everyone to the Selectman's Corner. Some items of interest are: fiber optics in Warren, working with organizations on the Opioid epidemic, held a CPR/AED class for residents, completing the requirements to keep our Heart Safe Community status, curbside

composting program, and EV stations at the Town Hall. Within the workings of the office, we have been holding educational staff meetings, adopting cyber security policies, working on a HR handbook, cross training, and of course the 2023-24 budget. Our Capital Plan is constantly changing based on immediate and projected needs of the Town.

What I am very happy to have been apart of for almost a year, is a new Paramedic contract for our Town. We currently are part of a seven town contract, but as of July 1, 2023, the contract will be up and a very large town will not be joining us. The smaller six towns had to negotiate with a new paramedic service so we could continue to have these services in our towns. I felt with my EMS background, I could see both sides of the negotiations and with the First Selectman in Kent (also with EMS background) we were able to bring a contract for all six towns together. As with all small towns, we will continue to partner with other towns and the COG to bring our residents the best services we can while keeping our expenses at a minimum.

At the BOS meetings, we continue to keep everyone updated on the newly adopted RSD #20. Currently we are in the "March Madness" of voting on a mascot. Check out the website and vote for your favorite. I am happy to announce that Chris Leone has been contracted to be the Superintendent for the new region. Congratulations!

Thank you to our DPW staff which has kept our roads plowed, salted/sanded and safe during this very unusual winter season.

Please join me for a Selectman's Corner at Warren Woods on Friday, June 2nd from 9:30-10:30 to talk about whatever you would like.

### FILING DEADLINES

#### **HOMEOWNERS BENEFIT PROGRAM**

A homeowner age of 65 and older who meet certain income limits may qualify for reduced taxes. The filing deadline is May 15.



## TAX EXEMPTIONS JUST AHEAD

## ADDITIONAL VETERAN'S EXEMPTION

A Veteran must file an Honorable Discharge Form DD-214 with the Town Clerk before October 1 and have served during an eligible time of war or conflict, although, Veterans receiving a disability through the Veterans Administration who have filed a DD214 qualify, whether, or not they served during the eligible dates.



#### **Additional Veteran's Exemption:**

A Veteran must have a DD214 on file with the Town Clerk and must meet certain income limits. The filing deadline is October 1.

Exemption for Blindness: To receive a \$3,000 assessment exemption, certification of blindness must be obtained from the State of Connecticut, Department of Human Resources, Board of Education and Services for the Blind. This certificate must be filed with the Assessor's office by October 1st.

<u>Exemption for Totally Disabled Persons</u>: To receive a \$1,000 assessment exemption, you must file an application with proof of permanent total disability from the Social Security Administration, by October 1st. The Physician's Certificate of Total and Permanent Disability Form can be used only when accepted proofs of disability from Social Security Administration, Veteran's Administration, or other governmental offices are not obtainable.

## Farm, Forest and Open Space Assessment:

The Application period is between September 1 and October 31. Contact the Assessor's office for details





#### **Motor Vehicles 20 Years Old and Older:**

Connecticut General Statute 12-71(b) states "...any antique, rare or special interest motor vehicle, as defined in section 14-1, shall be assessed at a value of not more than five hundred dollars."

Application must be filed no later than August 1 for a motor vehicle on the Regular Grand List and February 1 for a vehicle on the Supplemental Grand List.

#### From the Office of the Registrars

#### **Election Update**

Though it has rarely happened, it is possible that we could have a primary election leading up to our municipal election on November 7th. It's still too early in the year to determine, but the date for a primary, should we have one, would be September 12th. The last day that an enrolled elector can transfer from one party to another and be eligible to vote in the municipal primary of the new party is June 12th.



At our last election, Connecticut voters overwhelmingly approved the Constitutional amendment to allow for early voting. "In November, 59% of voters approved the Constitutional amendment to allow for early voting," Secretary of State Stephanie Thomas wrote to legislators. "You now have the important task of shaping legislation that provides increased access to voters, creates minimal strain on our municipalities and election officials, and is easily understood by the public."

The Secretary's recommendations urge for a period of voting spanning 10 days, including the two weekends preceding Election Day, provide weekday early morning and evening hours, and be implemented for the 2023 municipal elections. Additionally, Thomas urged the legislature to provide adequate funding for municipalities to implement the program seamlessly. "It is imperative that any program be fully funded by the state to cover the costs of training materials, staff time, ballots and envelopes, chain of custody storage equipment, municipal technological upgrades, and any other incurred expenses," Thomas wrote. Discussions in the Legislature are ongoing to determine what early voting in CT will look like. Stay tuned...

Contact the Registrars at 860-868-7881x109 or at <u>Registrars@WarrenCT.org</u> with any questions or to register in person. Watch the town website and social media for election updates and special voter registration drives that will occur as these voting dates near.

#### **Building Department**

Even though it is not pool season, now would be a good time to make sure your pool has a Certificate of Approval. As a homeowner, you are required by law to maintain your pool safety equipment. This applies to all pools, hot tubs and spas. Anyone who has had a pool installed is required to have a final inspection and



Certificate of Approval prior to using the pool. If you are planning on installing a swimming pool and have a question regarding whether or not you need a permit, the definition of a swimming pool determined by the State Building Code is: "Any structure intended for swimming or recreational bathing that contains water over 24 inches (610 mm) deep. This includes in-ground, aboveground and on-ground

swimming pools, hot tubs and spas."

Section R110.10 of the 2021 International Residential portion of the 2022 State Building Code – The building official shall issue a certificate of approval indicating substantial compliance with the requirements of this code for all completed work that requires a building permit but does not require a certificate of occupancy. Such work shall include, but not be limited to: fences greater than 7 feet in height; retaining walls greater than 3 feet in height; decks; garages; **swimming pools**; basements and attics converted to habitable space; electrical, plumbing, and mechanical repairs or alterations. No certificate of approval shall be issued for work subject to the zoning regulations of a municipality without certification in writing by the official charged with the enforcement of such regulations that the work is in conformity with such regulations or is a valid nonconforming use under such regulations.

While the garden wasn't growing over the winter, our garden community and its basket of ideas for the future most certainly have been! We kicked off our monthly meetings in 2023 with an informative and delicious sourdough breadmaking workshop led by local artisan bread makers Bruce and Yobana Young of Blue Gate Farms. Joanne Tiedmann joined us in February to share her expertise on starting seeds in advance of planting time. And a fruit tree pruning workshop

and work session led by Bill and Joslyn Pollack and their Arbor Tree Services crew was the highlight of our March gathering. We are so grateful for these community members who have shared their invaluable expertise so generously. Thank you so much!

The winter was also a good time for analyzing our garden's soil and determining the best treatment to enhance soil health and productivity as we dig into our new season. Garden members, with the assistance of Connecticut's *Agriculture Experiment Station* performed soil tests that indicate our garden soil is in good shape thanks to amendments completed last year. But there is room for improvement and we have an organic fertilizer regimen to implement now and through bed prep in April.

New ideas that are sprouting at the WCG include a Children's Garden in one of the large beds, a renovation of the Wasley's former blueberry grove, field trips to neighboring farms and a composting workshop. Please let us know if you have ideas or expertise that you would like to share.
