From the Assessor's Office

HOMEOWNERS BENEFIT PROGRAM



Applications for property tax credit for elderly or totally disabled homeowners are available at the Assessor's office. To qualify, a homeowner must meet the following criteria:

The home for which the credit is being sought must be the homeowner's primary residence. The homeowner must have owned the home on or before October 1, 2018.



A homeowner must have reached the age of 65 by the end of 2018, although totally disabled homeowners are eligible regardless of age.

The income limits are \$36,000 for single applicants and \$43,900 combined income for married applicants.

Proof of all income for 2018 must be provided. If an applicant files an Income Tax Return, a full copy must be provided with copies of all 1099's. If an applicant receives Social Security benefits, a copy of the SSA 1099 form must be provided.

RENTERS RELIEF PROGRAM



Applications for elderly or totally disabled renters who wish to apply for the Renters Relief Program are available at the Warren Assessor's office. To qualify, a renter must meet the following criteria:

A renter must have reached the age of 65 by December 31, 2018. A disabled renter must have reached the age of 18 by December 31, 2018.

A renter must be a permanent resident of Warren.

A renter must meet the maximum income requirement of \$43,000 for a married couple or \$35,300 for a single person.

The filing period is April 1 through October 1. An applicant must provide proof of income received in 2018. If an applicant has filed an income tax return and/or received an SSA 1099 from Social Security, a copy must be provided.

An applicant must submit proof of payment made for rent and utility services for 2017.

ADDITIONAL VETERAN'S EXEMPTION

Applications for the Additional Veteran's Exemption are available in the Assessor's office. To qualify, you must be considered a resident of Warren and your DD214 must be on file with the Warren Town Clerk no later than September 30, 2019. The income limits are \$36,000 for single applicants and \$43,900 combined income for married applicants.



Proof of all income for 2018 must be provided. If you file an Income Tax Return, a Copy must be provided. If you receive Social Security benefits, a copy(s) of your SSA 1099 must be provided. Veterans disability payments are not considered income for this program.

Income limits for veterans with a 100% disability rating are \$18,000 for single individuals and \$21,000 for married couples. In this case, Social Security benefits are not considered income.

Warren Parks and Recreation is pleased to announce our Sixth Annual Summer Concert Series. We are having three new groups and one returning group for your entertainment. It is very special how the town continues to embrace the Saturday evening concerts. We again invite the community and their family and friends to join us at this year's concerts.

All concerts are on Saturday evening from 5:30 – 8:30 pm at Warren Woods, except for Night Shift, which is from 5:30-7:30pm. Pick up a Picnic from Warren General Store and enjoy the concert and don't worry about what's for dinner! The Warren Church on July 27th, will have their Annual Chicken BBQ. Warren Woods has become the town's backyard for the Summer Concert Series. Our concerts are presented by the Warren Parks and Recreation Department and partially funded by a grant from the Connecticut Community Foundation. Although all concerts are free, donations will be accepted and go to fund future concerts.



Saturday July 13th- The Tradesman is a 4-piece Classic Rock, Blues, Country, and Oldies band, comprised of members John Ducci, Mark Marchetti, Ted Dregger, and Todd Buslewicz (collectively, the "Band"). They perform songs by popular artists such as The Beatles, CCR, ZZ Top, Eric Clapton, Allman Brothers, Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash,

Stevie Ray Vaughan, Rolling Stones and many others. The Band is clean-cut and family-friendly. All members have played their instruments for 20 to 40 years. They have also worked as music instructors, in the field of live sound production and sound engineering of studio recordings.

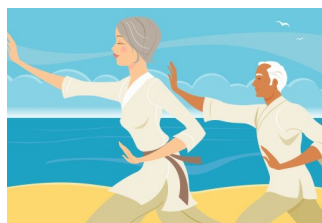

Elizabeth Park Rose Garden - Thursday June 13th



Opened to the public in 1897, Elizabeth Park was born of the American Park Movement. Elizabeth Park is the botanical gem of the Hartford park system. It is 101 acres in size, with 82 acres in West Hartford and 19 acres in Hartford. Because of its garden, it has been called the "Flower of New England Parks." The rose garden is the heart and

soul of the park and is the first public rose garden in the country, opened in 1904. Elizabeth Park is listed on the National Register of Historical Places.

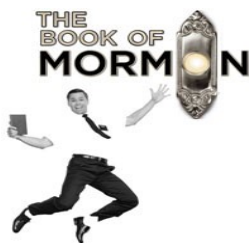

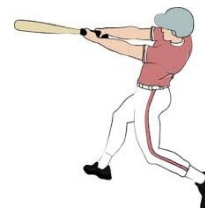

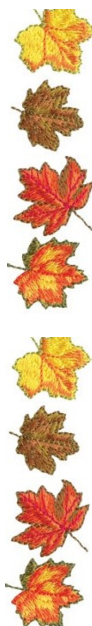

Warren Land Trust

The Warren Land Trust is a conservation organization dedicated to the preservation of the rural character of Warren. Our mission is to preserve farmland, open space, natural and endangered resources such as wetlands, forests and wildlife habitats, to encourage outright gifting of land for permanent protection and the use of conservation easements to preserve open space.

2019 is WLT's 30th anniversary year, and we already have something to celebrate! If you haven't heard, the Town of Warren, in partnership with the Warren Land Trust, Weantinoge Heritage Land Trust, Lake Waramaug Task Force and the Northwest Hills Council of Governments, recently received a \$22,800 grant from the Connecticut Department of Agriculture through the Community Investment Act, with an additional \$18,885 of in-kind support from WLT and partner organizations. This "Warren's Farming Future" grant will develop a long-term, actionable plan to support farm viability, sustainable farming practices and farmland preservation in Warren, and will help implement key agricultural strategies from our 2019-2029 Plan of Conservation and Development.

In this anniversary year, we want to share our past achievements and future hopes with the community; the theme for our celebration is "public access, public benefit." You'll see that in the form of programming, collaboration, and outreach, as well as in an upgraded trail system and maps. Updates forthcoming!

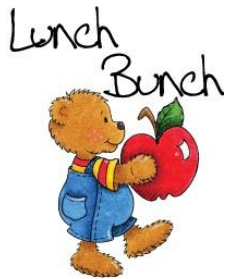

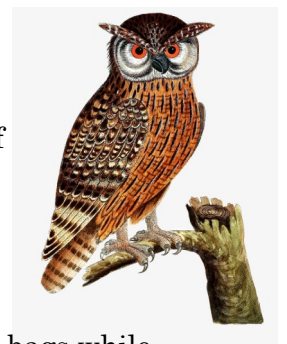
