### From the Office of the First Selectman

The Town held its Annual Budget Meeting on Thursday, May 16th and voted the 2019-2020 budget in. Please take a moment to review our new budget now on the website. We are happy to announce that the Board of Finance voted to keep the 14,25 mill rate for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. Congratulations to Rebecca Holmes, Lake Waramaug Authority



and Doug Winkel, RSD6 Board of Education, for volunteering their time to serve on their respective committees. The Town re-elected both candidates in for another term.



The Highway Department is already busy installing drainage and repaving Hardscrabble Road and replacing a major cross culvert on Melius Road. J. Tanner, Road Foreman, has been evaluating the town roads all winter and has targeted a few roads for repairs this summer. If you have driven by or stopped at Warren Woods, you may have noticed some trees have been removed, the pond area cleaned and repairs to buildings and grounds

have been done. This is all part of the "Beautification" being done by our Public Works Department. Tree removal of dead or infected Ash trees will continue throughout the summer.

Alexandrea Papp, a Warren Resident, had an idea to invite Warren businesses together and possibly form a Business Association in Warren. Local business owners were invited to attend the meetings in May at the Warren HUB. The meetings proved that by working together they would be able to achieve their individual goals as well as those of the Town. Many different topics were discussed and the continuation of meeting together should prove to be very productive. **So what's next? Planning**: meetings scheduled over the next couple of months (see schedule below) **Spread the Word:** since they have limited means of communication, they would like all business owners to spread the word to others about the meetings and invite them to attend. ### From the Office of the Tax Collector

### TAX COLLECTOR'S NOTICE

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 12-145 of the Connecticut General Statutes, notice is hereby given to the taxpayers of the Town of Warren

that taxes on the Grand List of October 1, 2018 are due and payable July 1, 2019. Taxes remaining unpaid after August 1, 2019 will be delinquent and will be subject to an interest penalty at the rate of 1 ½% per month or fraction thereof from the due date of July 1, 2019, with a minimum interest charge of \$2.00. If mailed, payments must be postmarked no later than August 1, 2019. Taxes may be paid at the Town Hall on Mondays and Thursdays from 9 am to 1 pm and on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9 am to 4 pm. Payments may be sent by mail addressed to the Tax Collector, 50 Cemetery Road, Warren, CT 06754. Payments can also be made online by going to https://www.warrenct.org/tax-collector.

### From the Assessor's Office



### **HOMEOWNERS BENEFIT PROGRAM**

Applications for property tax credit for elderly or totally disabled homeowners are available at the Assessor's office. To qualify, a homeowner must meet the following criteria:



The home for which the credit is being sought must be the homeowner's primary residence. The homeowner must have owned the home on or before October 1, 2018.

A homeowner must have reached the age of 65 by the end of 2018, although totally disabled homeowners are eligible regardless of age.

The income limits are \$36,000 for single applicants and \$43,900 combined income for married applicants.

Proof of all income for 2018 must be provided. If an applicant files an Income Tax Return, a full copy must be provided with copies of all 1099's. If an applicant receives Social Security benefits, a copy of the SSA 1099 form must be provided.



### RENTERS RELIEF PROGRAM

Applications for elderly or totally disabled renters who wish to apply for the Renters Relief Program are available at the Warren Assessor's office. To qualify, a renter must meet the following criteria:

A renter must have reached the age of 65 by December 31, 2018. A disabled renter must have reached the age of 18 by December 31, 2018.

A renter must be a permanent resident of Warren.

A renter must meet the maximum income requirement of \$43,000 for a married couple or \$35,300 for a single person.

The filing period is April 1 through October 1. An applicant must provide proof of income received in 2018. If an applicant has filed an income tax return and/or received an SSA 1099 from Social Security, a copy must be provided.

An applicant must submit proof of payment made for rent and utility services for 2017.

### ADDITIONAL VETERAN'S EXEMPTION

Applications for the Additional Veteran's Exemption are available in the Assessor's office. To qualify, you must be considered a resident of Warren and your DD214 must be on file with the Warren Town Clerk no later than September 30, 2019. The income limits are \$36,000 for single applicants and \$43,900 combined income for married applicants.



Proof of all income for 2018 must be provided. If you file an Income Tax Return, a Copy must be provided. If you receive Social Security benefits, a copy(s) of your SSA 1099 must be provided. Veterans disability payments are not considered income for this program.

Income limits for veterans with a 100% disability rating are \$18,000 for single individuals and \$21,000 for married couples. In this case, Social Security benefits are not considered income.

## Land Use Department

### Sequence of Events for Construction of Dwellings, Additions, Pools or Accessory Buildings

As summer approaches, many residents begin to plan for spring building and improvement projects. Please be aware that dwellings, additions, barns, garages, decks, pools, and sheds all require permits. This includes "COVER-IT" type sheds and Storable Swimming Pools. The Inland Wetlands Regulations, Zoning Regulations and Town Ordinances are available online at www.warrenct.org. Here is a summary of the various steps involved for obtaining the required approvals:

- 1) For a new house, have a soil scientist flag any wetlands on the lot and have an engineer/surveyor develop a site plan that shows the proposed house, driveway, septic system, well location, and any wetlands or watercourses located by the soil scientist. Contact Torrington Area Health District at (860) 489-0436 for a list of soil scientists.
- 2) For a new house, obtain approval from the Torrington Area Health District for the proposed septic system and well location. If there is a septic system on your lot, the Health District must approve all additions, decks, and accessory buildings. The Health District has a separate pool application permit that must be obtained for all new swimming pools. Contact Richard Rossi, Sanitarian, at Torrington Area Health District at (860) 489-0436.
- 3) Obtain an Inland Wetlands Permit from the Warren Inland Wetlands Commission for any work proposed within 100' of a wetlands or watercourse (the regulated inland wetlands areas.) The Commission regulates construction, filling, and removal of material within the regulated wetlands and watercourse area. Contact Stacey Sefcik, Zoning and Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer on Mondays and Wednesdays between 9:30am and 12:30pm at 860-868-7881 x 117. The Inland Wetlands Commission currently meets the fourth Thursday of each month at 7:00pm at Warren Town Hall. Applications should be submitted one week prior to a meeting.
- 4) Obtain a driveway permit from the Planning and Zoning Commission and the First Selectman for all new driveways and modifications to existing driveways. The Town's driveway regulations are detailed in Section 9 of the Town of Warren Zoning Regulations. Applications are available in the Land Use Office and the First Selectman's Office.
- 5) Obtain a Zoning Permit from Stacey Sefcik, Zoning & Inland Wetlands Enforcement Officer, for proposed houses, additions, decks, pools, and accessory buildings including "cover-it" sheds and storable pools. The required setbacks in all zones throughout the Town of Warren are 30 feet for the front yard and 25 feet for side yards and rear yards. Properties located on or near the shorelines of major water bodies within Town may be required to meet additional Shoreline Setback requirements (see Section 16 of the Zoning Regulations.) Pools, decks and accessory buildings all require Zoning and Building permits and must meet the minimum zoning setback requirements.
- 6) Obtain a Building Permit from Joe Manley, Building Official. (860) 868-7881 ext. 111. He is available on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 7:30am to 8:30am and Thursday afternoons from 4:30pm to 6:00pm.
- 7) Please be aware that while projects such as drainage improvements, patio installation, shoreline stabilization, pond maintenance, and removal of beaver dams may not require zoning or building permits they will likely still require Inland Wetlands approval. If you are in doubt as to whether a permit is needed for your proposed project, please contact Stacey Sefcik prior to commencing any work.

The Land Use & Building Office personnel are available to answer any questions you may have and to help you navigate the permitting process in order to get your project underway as quickly as possible.

### Thursday June 13th




Opened to the public in 1897, Elizabeth Park was born of the American Park Movement. Elizabeth Park is the botanical gem of the Hartford park system. It is 101 acres in size, with 82 acres in West Hartford and 19 acres in Hartford. Because of its garden, is has been called the "Flower of New England Parks." The rose

garden is the heart and soul of the park and is the first public rose garden in the country, opened in 1904. Elizabeth Park is listed on the National Register of Historical Places.




