THE OFFICE OF SOCIAL SERVICES

The Connecticut Tech Act Project: Assistive Technology Loan Program (ATLP)

ATLP assists Connecticut residents with disabilities and older adults to obtain assistive technology devices and services that they need to enhance independence and productivity in the community, in general, as well as for education and employment.



Eligible applicants may borrow \$500 - \$30,000, at a low interest rate, for up to 10 years depending upon the life of the device. The ATLP can be used for a broad range of devices such as assistive listening devices, magnifiers, computers and software, scooters, stair lifts, modified vehicles, and much more.

Charter Oak Pass – Life Use

The Charter Oak Pass provides access to the State Parks and Forests at no cost to Connecticut residents, age 65 or older.

The pass is accepted at day use areas where a parking fee applies. Presenting the pass allows for free access to the vehicle and its passengers. The pass holder does not have to be the vehicle driver.



Free admittance also is provided for the pass holder when visiting Gillette Castle and Dinosaur or Fort Trumbull State Parks. Passes are non-transferable and are not valid for camping or special events.





WARREN HISTORICAL SOCIETY

As you read this newsletter, we will recently have held our third annual **Open House**. The event included an exhibit, "Art and Artists in Warren's History," featuring collection items, as well as artwork by participants in our arts heritage workshops on the drawing style of Eric Sloane. The exhibit will move to the Sloane Stanley Museum in Kent on June 12. The Open House also served as the occasion to announce winners of this year's **WHS Scholarships**, two awards of \$1000 each. Earlier this spring, we participated in the Give Local fundraising campaign organized by the Connecticut Community Foundation. Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we were able to purchase photographic equipment and accessories allowing us to document collection items at the highest standards.

What's coming up next at the Warren Historical Society?

The current **exhibit** in our Town Hall display case, located in Town Hall focuses on "Artists of Warren." Stop by have a look!

July 4th Bell-Ringing, July 4th, 1:30pm. As is tradition, we will "let freedom ring" on the 4th. We will meet at the WHS space in the Community Center; weather permitting, we will move outdoors. After a reading of the Preamble to the Declaration of Independence, we will ring bells to commemorate its signing. Refreshments will be served, but BYOB (Bring Your Own Bell!).

Kent and Warren in the 18th Century, July 1-October 1, Saturdays and Sundays 10am-2pm, Seven Hearths, 4 Studio Hill Road (at Route 7), Kent. This exhibit, in cooperation with the Kent Historical Society, focuses on key aspects of 18th-century life in Kent and Warren (which, for much of that century, constituted a single town). Our collection will be used to help illustrate daily life in the period, the towns' original proprietors, local government, and the new religious thinking emergent in this era.
