Beach cleanup will be held on May 13. Nine programs of entertainment have been planned throughout the summer. Don suggested having a Mexican night during one of the entertainment nights. He also noted there will be a donated bench installed this summer.

CONCERTS

Don noted all the concerts are in order for the summer. The commission needs to focus on the Grateful Dead All Stars and Fleetwood Macked concerts as they are ticketed events and will draw large crowds. Help will be needed those nights.

Food will be provided during the Fleetwood Macked concert by Meraki, Litchfield Distillery will have a tasting and there will be ice cream. At the chicken BBQ a country group called Cobblestone will perform.

PLANNED TRIPS

Don said upcoming trips in the planning include a trip to Newport and a Christmas show, a trip to Portsmouth, New Hampshire and Strawberry Banke, a wine tasting trip to upstate New York. He said a lot of people have signed up for the Alaska trip.

He also said he is working on smaller-scale local trips with a 12-passenger bus and is seeking suggestions.

CLASSES

Don said the Bend and Stretch exercise class has started and 10 people attended. A recent flower arranging class led by Wamogo students was held with future classes at Thanksgiving and Christmas planned.
